The easiest way is to upload the video to a site blip.tv, which will automatically upload all your work to iTunes. If you want to do it yourself, you'll need to create a video blog first. This is the page you'll use to post your video online. Then set up a feedburner account to syndicate your video blog. Feedburner adds a feature to your video blog that automatically alerts subscribers when posting new content. Once you've set up your FeedBurner account, you can upload your video blog to iTunes. In the podcasts section of the iTunes Store, select Upload podcast, which will guide you through the process of getting movies listed in the iTunes Store. When your videos appear in the iTunes Store, anyone interested can subscribe to and automatically download new videos every time you post them. If you've worked hard to create original content and want to sell it through iTunes, you're in luck. iTunes accepts original feature films and documentaries that were originally released in theaters or directly to video. They also accept short, higher quality videos. Basically, if it will look great in the theater, they will take it. There are a few videos that Apple won't take. The iTunes Store does not accept adult content, feature films, user-generated content (according to YouTube), or other types of videos that would not be considered movies or documentaries. In addition, videos must be uploaded in the language of the area where you are applying to distribute them, or you can add subtitles from that territory. If you created a live video, you can upload it to the Music section of the iTunes Store. To get there, you need to fill out the Apple music app. So you don't have it. Upload or sell your videos on iTunes. For best results, examine content aggregators that will take a lot of guesswork out of the process.
